INTRODUCTION

Established in 2000, the Clayoquot Biosphere Trust (CBT) Society is a federally-registered charity responsible for upholding the spirit and intent of the Clayoquot Sound UNESCO Biosphere Reserve designation. The CBT conducts and supports research, education, and programs that advance conservation, build our understanding of natural processes in the marine and terrestrial ecosystems, and promote the health of individuals and communities throughout the Clayoquot Sound Biosphere Reserve Region.

For the last 12 years, the CBT has worked closely with eight communities (including five Nuu-chah-nulth First Nations) through a governance model that invites participation of all communities in the region. The organization has developed expertise in the areas of grantmaking, administration, and fiscal accountability.

The Community Foundation Difference

As a community foundation, the CBT has a unique role to play, one that is different from the other charitable organizations in our communities. We seek and manage charitable funds of all kinds and sizes, from a myriad of donors, for a variety of purposes. We also invest the funds and make grants—many on the cutting edge of social change— across the entire region in response to constantly evolving challenges and opportunities.

This broad mandate calls upon the CBT to serve three distinct groups:

- Donors who wish to make meaningful contributions to the future health and well-being of our communities.

- Charitable organizations charged with providing programs and services to the community.
- The community-at-large who look to us for leadership in developing and preserving charitable capital in the community, and for using the available resources for the long-term benefit of the communities.

Purpose of the Directory

The purpose of this directory is to provide a comprehensive listing of all of the non-profit organizations within the Clayoquot Sound UNESCO Biosphere Reserve Region. Prior to the production of this directory in 2001, no single source of this information existed.
